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The Ascension of Our Lord (2021)

Holy Spirit, Light Divine, shine upon this heart of mine; Chase the shades of night away; turn the darkness into day. Let me see my Savior's face; let me all His beauties trace; Show those glorious truths to me which are only known to Thee. Amen.

Luke 24:44–53 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. My dear ones: despite the Holy Spirit's use of words like 'up' and 'sky' and 'on high'—and the apostles standing there, looking up. "Why?" the two men asked them!—

Despite all this 'up' language, the 'Going up,' the 'Ascension' of the Friend of sinners is the solid pledge that there IS...NO...UP...AND...DOWN any longer! Not with the Creator and Creation, man and God, sinners and the Holy One. No gaps.

So, there's your poor pastor's call to repentance for this week. Repent of the gaps! Take note of the times and places that a great chasm between you and your God appears—a gulf *you and I* insist is still there; not He! Recognize those pretend 'distances' for what they are: lies intended to harm. Then turn away. Actually, the Lord urges us to pray that we do not even encounter the temptation of the gaps. "Ooh! The *news.*" "Oh! Those people!" "Oh, that *pastor!*" No man can force a gap between you and your God!

It's clear the Savior has no confidence in *our* stability. Praise Him! Yes! *T...h...a...t* is *w...h...y* He 'was carried up.' To be, still, the Friend of sinners; the Friend of the fearful; the bosom buddy of those who say, daily and much, 'God is too far from me; I am too far from God.'

So He went *up.* *N...o...t* for Him, for His Father, for the Holy Spirit. But—like *e...v...e...r...y...t...h...i...n...g* Jesus does, He went 'up' for us.

"...and lifting up his hands he blessed them." What hands He lifted! Hands of blessing. What hands were those? The Holy Spirit *has* come from "on high." (Learn to start smirking and smiling when you hear 'up and down' terms in the Gospel.)

Hands!

³⁶ As they were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" 37 But they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit. ³⁸ And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me, and see. The best and the worst men used their hands to drive nails into the hands of Mary's firstborn Son; they nailed that man up onto a crossbeam to mock everything He was about. What was He about? We heard *that* the night He was born. He was born, etc., to erase the distance between heaven and earth.

Jesus said to his disciples, ⁴⁴ "Let these words sink into your ears: The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men." ⁴⁵ But they did not understand this saying, and it was concealed from them, so that they might not perceive it. And they were afraid to ask him about this saying. ²

Why? Why 'into the hands of men.' Why the wounding of His hands? Because of the 'gaps.'
